Old Brentford Baptist Chapel. North Road. Brentford.

On Lord's Day, January 1819 Public Worship was commenced in Old Brentford, and was regularly continued till June 4<sup>th</sup> 1819, when a Church of the Particular Baptist Denomination was formed, after which the Chapel was enlarged; and re-opened Monday, ~~October 6~~ <sup>September 6<sup>th</sup></sup> 1819. For more than 20 years the Church had been preserved amidst prosperity and adversity, at times on the mount and frequently in the valley, always contending for the faith once delivered unto the saints. In the Spring of 1839, a new piece of ground was purchased near the place where the old one stood in order to erect a place of worship for a Church of Christ of the Particular Baptist Denomination holding as Articles of faith:- Three Divine Persons in the Godhead.

Eternal and Personal Election.

Original sin.

Particular Redemption.

Free Justification by the imputed righteousness of Christ.

Efficacious Grace in regeneration.

The Word of God as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, a perfect rule for the conduct of all believers.

The Final Perseverance of the saints.

The Resurrection of the dead.

The future Judgment.

The eternal happiness of the righteous and the endless misery of the impenitent. Trusting to be enabled to hold these doctrines and hand the same down to succeeding generations, we deposit them in the corner-stone of the building as a proof that these truths are the life of the Church, those we live upon, and many among us have died rejoicing in, and trust when the present generation shall lie beneath the clods of the valley, the Church may continue, holding fast the same form of sound words, till the Archangels' blast shall say, - Arise, ye dead, and come to Judgment."
